80% at college and 20% on work placement.

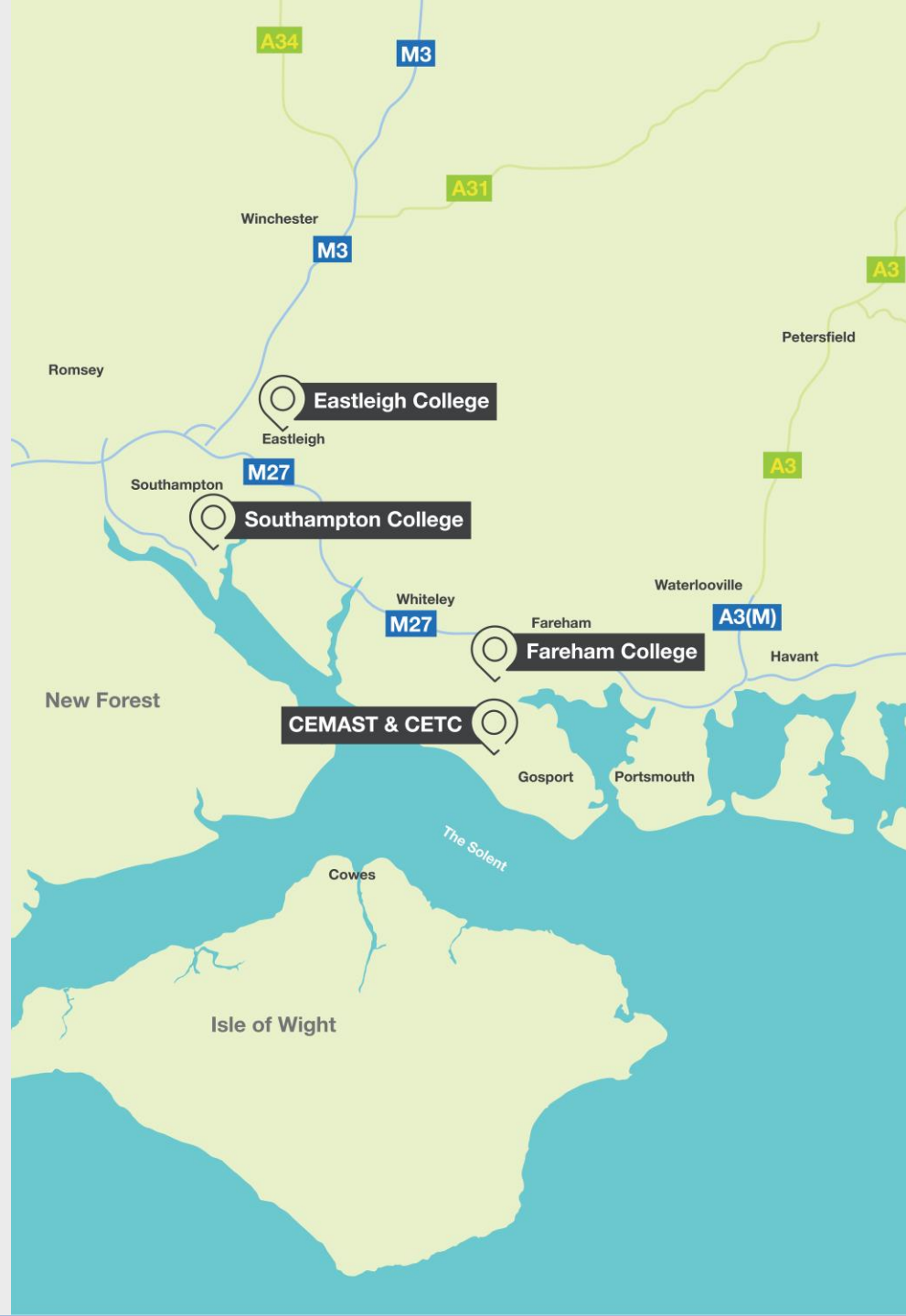

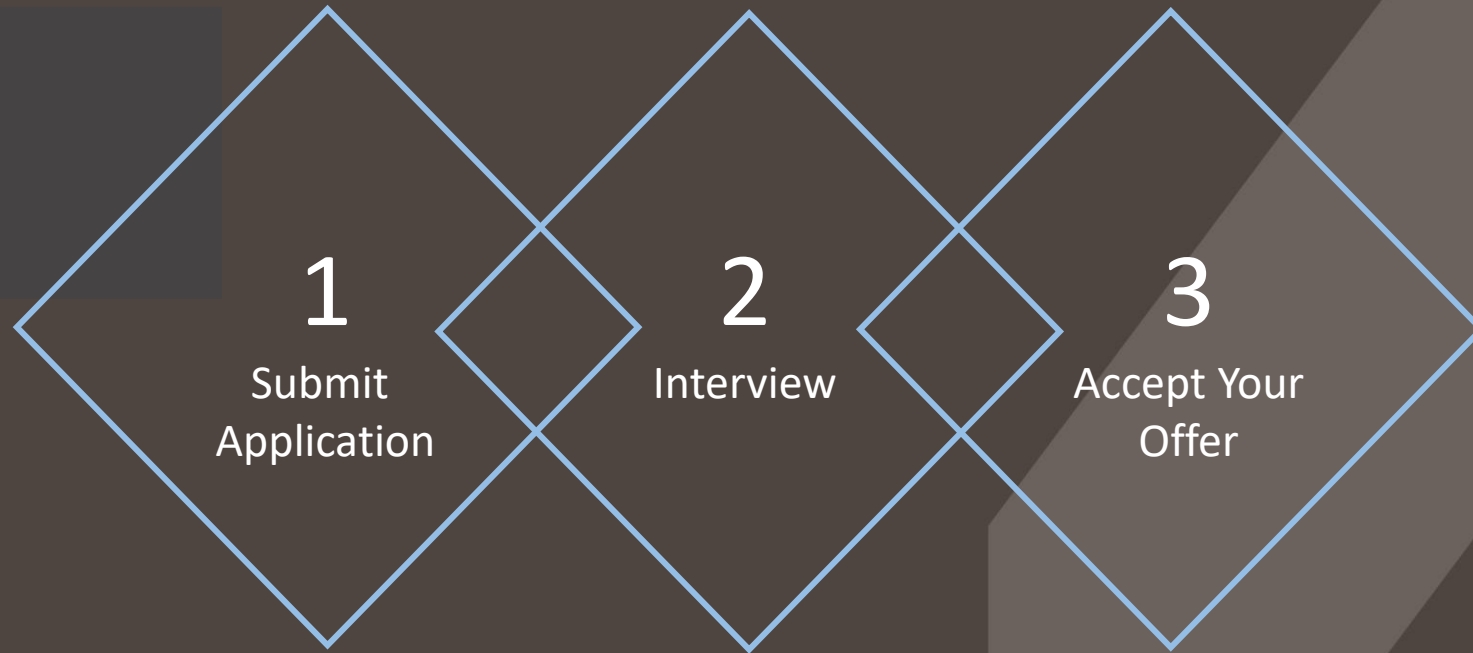
